Dear Life Study participant,

We are very grateful to you for taking part in Life Study and giving so generously of your time to help this important research. I wrote to you in October last year to let you know that the Research Councils were stopping their financial support for Life Study due to the serious challenges encountered in recruiting families to the Study.

Although we will not collect any new data from you or anyone else, we would still like to use the information that you have already provided for the benefit of children and families. We would like to include your information and any samples you donated in a small part of the Life Study which is still going ahead – the Baby Biome Study - and which has funding from the Wellcome Trust. This Study will compare caesarean section with normal birth and look at the effects of antibiotics given to the mother in pregnancy on her child's future health and risk of conditions such as asthma. This will help understand the pathways to asthma, and be helpful in planning future studies to improve children's health.
